

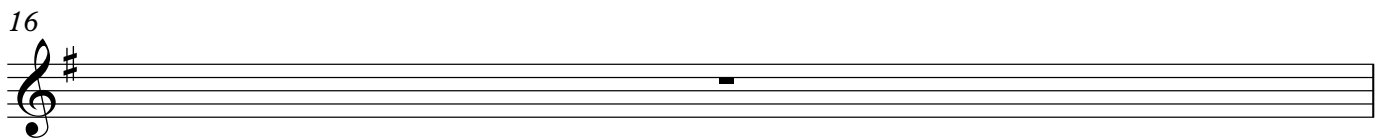
## List of Gangspil tunes

(All played in the video and three included here in sheet music)

1. **Amagerdans**: local trad tune from the Island of Amager that holds parts of Copenhagen, including the big international airport and the towns of Dragør and Store Magleby
2. **Tyrolervalse**: (two traditional waltz tunes from the northern region of Vendsyssel in Denmark. That's the same region that Dwig Lamb's (Danish American musician from Iowa) grandfather came from. Can be found as track one on our new double album "Gangspil 2")
3. **Fynbo**: traditional crooked polka from the playing of Frode Thomsen, Vinkel pr Højslev Midtjutland, Denmark
4. **Allemagasej & Svip svap svovlstikke**: two traditional Sønderhoning tunes from the island of Fanø
5. **Keraus**: traditional Danish tune often used as the last dance at parties

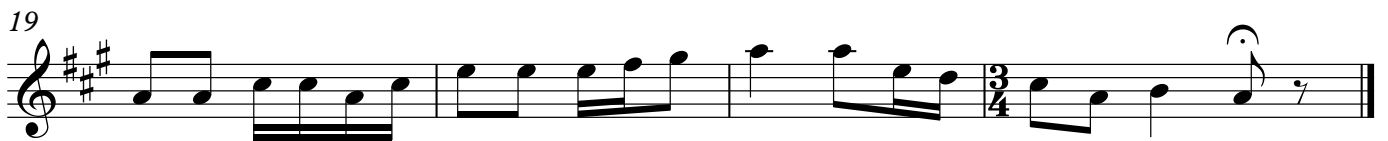
# Fynbo (crooked polka)
